



Apple

Generally, two different apple varieties are needed for cross-pollination. If crabapples are nearby, they can pollinate your apple. Like all fruits, apples prefer a sunny location. At least 6 hours of sun per day is optimal. Plant in well-drained soil. Trees should be within 50 feet of each other. Apple trees (5 gallon pot) should bear a full crop of fruit 3-5 years after planting. Larger plants will bear earlier. Store the fruit just



Cherry

Sweet cherries require cross-pollination, sour cherries are self-pollinating. Cherries prefer full sun and loose well-drained soil. They do poorly in heavy, wet clay. Harvest fruit when the skin loses its greenish cast. The fruit will keep for 1-2 weeks at just above freezing. 8-12' tall and wide.



Peach

The varieties we carry are all self-pollinating. Peaches prefer full sun and well-drained soil. 8-12' tall and wide.

Gala Small red fruit with vertical stripes in September. Sweet, firm, grainy flesh. Thinner skinned than most apples.

Golden Sentinel A very narrow tree (2-4' wide) with Yellow Delicious fruit in mid-October. This all-purpose apple is ideal in pots.

Granny Smith Green fruit in early November. Flesh is firm and crisp with an excellent tart flavor. Good for eating fresh, juice and cooking. Keeps very well, up to 6 months in cold storage.

Honeycrisp Red fruit in mid September. Exceptionally sweet, creamy and juicy flesh. Superior cold storage life, up to 7 months.

Jonagold Large yellow-green fruit in September. Fluffy, crisp and juicy flesh is sweet and tangy. Great for eating fresh, salads and pies. Cannot pollinate other apples.

McIntosh Red fruit in mid September. Flesh is sweet and juicy. Good for eating fresh, sauces and pies.

Northpole A very narrow tree (2-4' wide) with sweet, juicy MacIntosh fruit in mid-September. Good fresh, in sauces and pies. Great in pots.

Red Delicious Red fruit in early October. This sweet apple is good for eating fresh and for desserts.

Scarlet Sentinel A very narrow tree (2-4' wide) with greenish yellow fruit blushed with red. Crisp, sweet and juicy fruit store through February. Great in pots.

Yellow Delicious Self-pollinating. Deep gold fruit in mid October. An all-purpose apple good for eating fresh, sauces and juice. Good pollinator.

Bing Sweet. Black fruit in late June ripens all at once. Flesh is sweet, firm and juicy. Superb eating!

Black Tartarian Sweet. Purple-red fruit in late June. Dark red, juicy flesh. Good for eating fresh and canning.

Montmorency Sour. Light red fruit ripens in late June. Firm yellow flesh. USA's favorite tart cherry for pies and preserves.

Northstar Sour. Bright red fruit deepening to mahogany ripens in early July. Dark red, tender and juicy flesh. Resistant to leaf spot and brown rot. Excellent for pies and preserves.

Contender Red-gold fruit in mid August. Freestone. Sweet, extra juicy yellow flesh. Blooms later, helping to avoid late spring frosts.

Redhaven Yellow fruit with a red blush in late July to mid August. Freestone. Sweet, flavorful fine-grained flesh. Resistant to bacterial leaf spot. Good for eating fresh, canning and freezing.

Reliance Red-gold fruit in mid August. Freestone. Sweet, mild and firm flesh. Good for freezing and canning. Quite cold hardy.



Pears need cross-pollination. Pears prefer full sun and well drained soil. For larger pears, thin the fruit after they are set, leaving 1 fruit per cluster.

For fullest flavor, harvest fruit just as it begins to ripen (when color changes from green to light yellow-green) and allow it to finish ripening in a cool place such as an air-conditioned room. 8-12' tall and wide.



Some plums need cross pollination. Plums prefer full sun and well-drained soil. Allow fruit to ripen fully on the tree. Plums can be stored for a short time in the refrigerator, but are at their best soon after picking. Unless otherwise stated, 6-9' tall and wide.

Anjou Light green fruit in late August to early September. Maybe not as juicy as other varieties, but its firm texture makes it ideal for cooking.

Bartlett Yellow fruit late August to early September. Bears heavily and consistently. Sweet, juicy and firm flesh. Great for eating fresh or canning.

Golden Russet European Bosc. Cinnamon brown, long-necked, symmetrical fruit in late August to early September. The flesh is dense, firm, sweet and juicy. Great for baking, broiling and poaching.

Red Bartlett Red fruit in late August to early September. Fruit is sweeter than Bartlett.

American Persimmon

Excellent native tree. Edible, fleshy fruit in fall ripens after frost. Handsome, blocky bark on older trees. Red-yellow fall color can be spectacular. Hardy and adaptable. Once established this tree tolerates drought, clay soil and urban conditions. 40'x30'.

BlackIce European/Japanese hybrid cross. Large blue-black fruit with very sweet, juicy yellow flesh in early August. Superior winter hardiness.

Blues Jam Self-fertile European prune-type. 1 inch purple-blue fruit in mid to late September. Fruit is ideal for drying and jams.

Santa Rosa Self-fertile Japanese type. Deep red fruit in mid August. Sweet, fine-textured red flesh. The most popular plum in the USA. Great for eating fresh and canning.

Toka European/Japanese hybrid cross. Medium sized red fruit in mid August. Richly flavored apricot colored flesh. One of the best pollinators. Great for eating fresh. 15' tall and wide.
