

Viburnum is a large genus of deciduous and broadleaf evergreen shrubs. One can be found to suit almost any purpose in your garden. Some produce wonderfully fragrant blossoms while others display showy flowers followed by attractive fruits and colorful fall foliage. Plant viburnum in full sun for best growth, although most will tolerate some shade. Rich, moist, well-drained soil is preferred.

<b>Alleghany</b> <i>Viburnum x rhytidophylloides</i>	Vase	10'x10'	○ / ●	Yellowish white flowers bloom above leaves. Dark green, leathery foliage holds through early winter. Bright red fruit turns shiny black in fall. Dense habit.
<b>Brandywine</b> <i>Viburnum nudum</i>	Rounded	4'x4'	○ / ●	Stunning, lustrous green leaves turn red to reddish purple in fall. Creamy white flowers are followed by clusters of fruit in changing from green to vivid pink and blue. Best in a sheltered location and acidic soil.
<b>Cardinal Candy</b> <i>Viburnum dilatatum</i>	Rounded	6'x6'	○ / ●	Profuse, creamy white flat-topped flower clusters in late spring are followed by persistent, glossy red fruit in fall. Glossy leaves turn bronzy to russet in fall and tend to hang on late.
<b>Cayuga</b> <i>Viburnum x carlesii</i> <i>x carlcephalum</i>	Rounded	8'x8'	○ / ●	Pink buds and clove-scented white flowers are present at the same time in April. Somewhat shiny, dark green foliage. Upright habit in youth, becoming more spreading with age.
<b>Cranberrybush, Compact</b> <i>Viburnum trilobum</i>	Rounded	6'x5'	○ / ●	Excellent tight form with uniform branching. Dense foliage. Red fall color. No significant flowers or fruits. Great in shade.
<b>Cranberrybush, Redwing</b> <i>Viburnum trilobum</i>	Rounded	10'x8'	○ / ●	Leaves emerge brick red then turn rich crimson in fall. White lace-cap flowers in May are followed by showy clusters of edible scarlet berries in fall. A plant for all seasons!
<b>Cranberrybush, Wentworth</b> <i>Viburnum trilobum</i>	Rounded	10'x10'	○ / ●	Handsome lace-cap white flowers in May are followed by clusters of edible scarlet fruit that are great for preserves. Foliage turns red in fall.
<b>Arrowwood, Autumn Jazz</b> <i>Viburnum dentatum</i>	Vase	8'x8'	○ / ●	Glossy bright green foliage turns yellow, orange and red in fall. Creamy white, flat-topped flowers in June followed by clusters of blue-black fruit in fall. Graceful habit.
<b>Arrowwood, Blue Muffin</b> <i>Viburnum dentatum</i>	Rounded	6'x6'	○ / ●	Large, lustrous dark green leaves with orange to red-purple fall color. Creamy white, flat-topped June flowers. Intense blue, pea-sized fruit attracts birds.
<b>Arrowwood, Chicago Lustre</b> <i>Viburnum dentatum</i>	Vase	8'x8'	○ / ●	Glossy dark green foliage turns red-purple in fall. Creamy white, flat-topped flowers in June followed by blue-black fruit in fall.

Name	Form	HxW	Exposure	Description
<b>Arrowwood, Raspberry Tart</b> <i>Viburnum dentatum</i>	Rounded	4'x4'	○ / ●	A small, compact version of Arrowwood. White flat-topped flowers in June are followed by clusters of blue fruit. Glossy leaves turn raspberry red in fall.
<b>Blackhaw</b> <i>Viburnum prunifolium</i>	Rounded	15'x10'	○ / ●	Handsome, creamy white flowers in May followed by edible bluish black fruit. Dark green leaves turn reddish-purple in fall. Very shade tolerant. Use as a small specimen tree or in a large shrub border.
<b>Blackhaw, Summer Magic</b> <i>Viburnum prunifolium</i>	Vase	10'x8'	○ / ●	New growth emerges red and changes to pink. Mature leaves are dark and leathery. Reddish yellow fall color. Very shade tolerant. Nice as specimen.
<b>Burkwood Mohawk</b> <i>Viburnum x burkwoodii</i>	Rounded	6'x8'	○ / ●	Highly fragrant white flowers open from dark pink buds. Dark green leaves turn orange-red in fall. Extremely ornamental.
<b>Doublefile, Kern's Pink</b> <i>Viburnum plicatum</i>	Upright	8'x6'	○ / ●	Carnation-like flowers in spring are soft pink, sometimes reverting to white. The foliage is bronzed in fall. No fruit.
<b>Doublefile, Marie's</b> <i>Viburnum plicatum var. tomentosum</i>	Spreading	6'x8'	○ / ●	Delicate-looking white flowers float above the horizontal branches in May. Deeply veined leaves turn red-purple in fall. Tiered branching forms a layered look.
<b>Doublefile, Popcorn</b> <i>Viburnum plicatum</i>	Rounded	6'x6'	○ / ●	Profuse, white, popcorn ball-shaped flowers in spring are followed by red fruit in summer. Nice scarlet to purple fall color.
<b>Doublefile, Summer Snowflake</b> <i>Viburnum plicatum var. tomentosum</i>	Spreading	5'x6'	○ / ●	Snow-white flowers bloom in June then sporadically until October. Black berries and reddish-purple foliage adorn the shrub in the fall. An upright, rather narrow form with smaller flowers, fruit and leaves than other doublefile cultivars.
<b>Dwarf Fragrant</b> <i>Viburnum farreri</i>	Rounded	3'x3'	○ / ●	Pink buds open into highly fragrant white flowers in spring. Small, bronzy green leaves with a slight sheen turn reddish purple in fall. Plant near a window or walkway to enjoy the fragrance.
<b>European Snowball</b> <i>Viburnum opulus</i>	Rounded	8'x8'	○ / ●	An old favorite, showy in bloom with ball-like apple-green flowers turning white. Very hardy.
<b>Judd</b> <i>Viburnum x juddii</i>	Rounded	5'x6'	○ / ●	Semi-snowball type with clove-scented white flowers. Medium green foliage turns burgundy purple in fall. Full, rounded habit. Improved form of Koreanspice.
<b>Koreanspice</b> <i>Viburnum carlesii</i>	Rounded	5'x8'	○ / ●	Reddish-pink buds open to semi-snowball type, fragrant white flowers. Dark green leaves turn wine red in fall. Red fruit darkens to shiny black. Upright branching.
<b>Koreanspice, Compact</b> <i>Viburnum carlesii</i>	Rounded	3'x3'	○ / ●	Dwarf. Same flowering and foliage as the species. Lovely garden accent.
<b>Mohican</b> <i>Viburnum lantana</i>	Vase	10'x8'	○ / ●	Creamy white flowers and new fuzzy, pale green leaves appear together in early May. Compact form. Orange-red fruit appears in July. Fall color is burgundy. Excellent for screening or mass planting.
<b>Winterthur</b> <i>Viburnum nudum</i>	Upright	6'x4'	○ / ●	Shiny leaves turn scarlet in fall. White flowers in spring followed by fruit clusters changing from white to pink to blue. The fall combo is incredible. Best in a sheltered location and acidic soil.
